Summer Abroad Program: The “Brazilian Literature, Culture, and the Arts” program is offered each summer in Salvador, Brazil. Students may earn 8 UCD units toward the upper-division portion of the minor in this program.

Education Abroad Program (EAP) options: We encourage students to consider academic-year EAP programs at the UC Center Bahia (Salvador) and the Pontificia Católica Universidade do Rio de Janeiro (PUC-Rio). Students may complete a significant amount of their lower and upper division coursework in these programs.
