

Upper Division - Depth Subject Matter One course in each of the following five areas (5 classes):

Spanish 100/S, 141/S, or 170/S

Introduction to Spanish Literature Spanish 130, 131N, 134A/B, or 142

Introduction to Latin-American Literature Spanish 150N, 151N, 157, or 159/S

Spanish 117, 174, 176, or 177

In addition, student must take: Six upper-division Spanish electives (which means all upper-division SPA courses count as electives) No course repeats, unless it is a different topic**

Upper Division - Depth Subject Matter

Do I need to take the Spanish placement exam?

No-If students has AP scores of (3,4,5)

No- If student has never taken any Spanish courses. Student start at SPA 001.

No- If student has taken Spanish courses at another college.

Yes- If student took Spanish in high school but did not take AP test. Student could test for their proficiency level. **Speak to Spanish major advisor**

Yes- If student has AP score of 2 or less.

Yes- If student has IB score that does not satisfy foreign language requirement.
